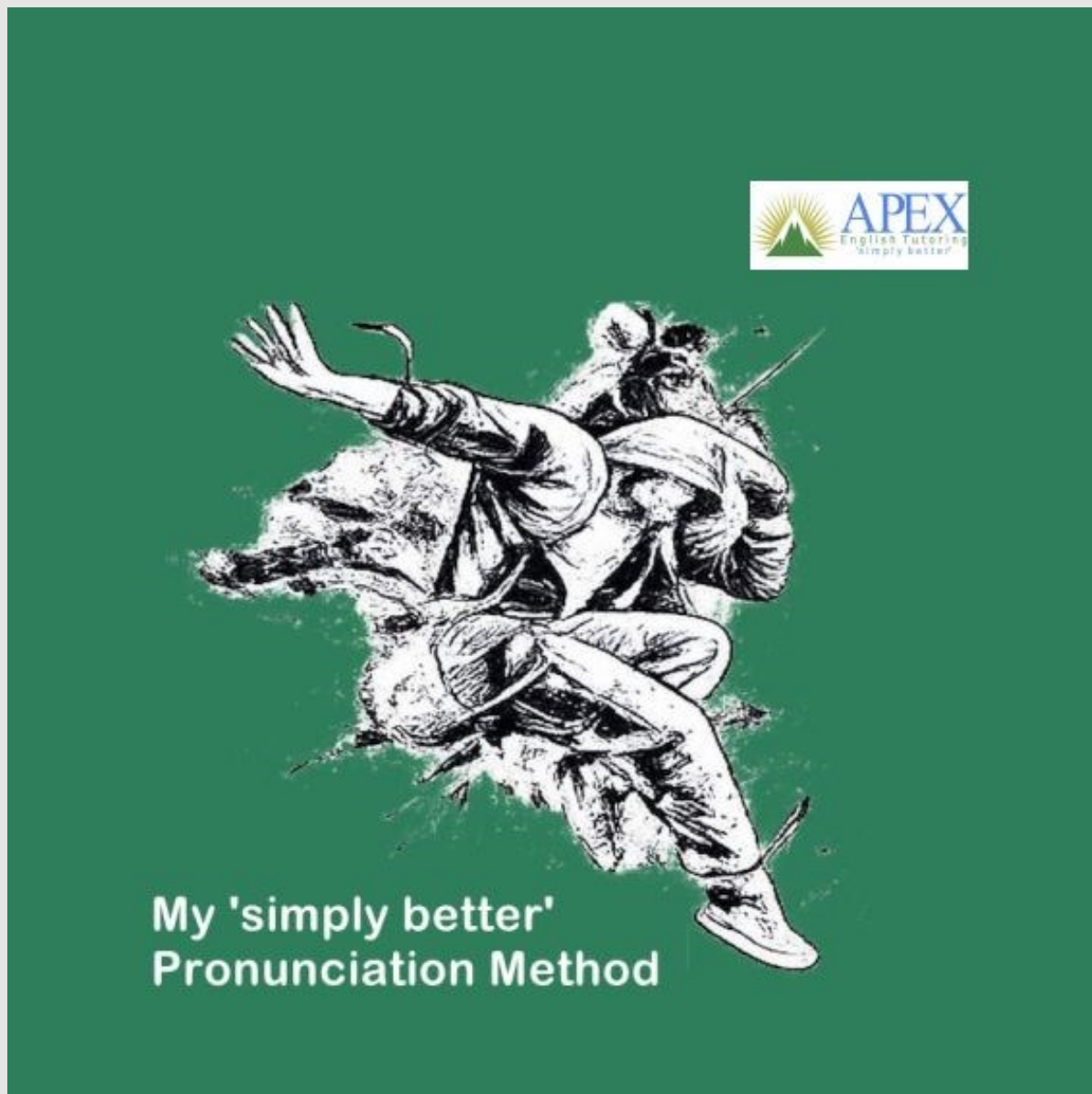

Plus, it's a great way to bond with your friend while learning English together.

**So, pick your favourite scene and start acting!**
